# From FIRST: Just in case you missed it! - Looking back on the 2024 KitBot & Moving Forward

Last year, we [FIRST] introduced the concept of a KitBot where teams were provided with a basic robot design, parts, and instructions to build a robot tailored to the season's game. We wanted to take some time to share some of the feedback we saw on the 2024 KitBot and some improvements that we are making for the 2025 season.

One of the main goals of the KitBot was to provide a baseline design and resource that helped raise the floor. It was intended to provide a starting point that teams could iterate on and improve. It was specifically designed to not be able to do all the tasks in the game. Based on data provided to us by Team 118, there were 528 KitBots that competed in the 2024 season, or 15% of teams.

# **September Holidays and Events:**

This month corresponds with Mexican Independence Day, which is celebrated on September 16th and recognizes the revolution in 1810 that ended the Spanish dictatorship.

September 2: Labor Day in the United States honors the contribution that workers have made to the country and is observed on the first Monday of September.

September 6 to 15: Onam (Hinduism) - A harvest festival celebrated in Kerala, India.

September 7: Ganesh Chaturthi is a Hindu holiday lasting approximately 10 days in which the elephant-headed Hindu god is praised and given offerings.

September 8: International Literacy Day

September 11: Rastafarians celebrate the Ethiopian New Year and believe that Ethiopia is their spiritual home.

September 15 to 16: Mawlid, Mawlid an-Nabi ash-Sharif, or Eid Milad un Nabi, is the observance of the birthday of the Islamic prophet Muhammad.

September 16: Mexican Independence Day

September 18: International Equal Pay Day was celebrated for the first time in 2020. It represents the long-standing efforts toward the achievement of equal pay for work of equal value.

September 21: International Day of Peace, also officially known as World Peace Day

September 22: Mabon, the second harvest ritual celebrated in Gaelic, Pagan, and Wiccan traditions, is the first day of fall and the celebration of the vernal equinox. The holiday is about gathering wisdom and honoring elders.

September 27: Elevation of the Life Giving Cross (Holy Cross) is a day that commemorates the cross used in the crucifixion of Jesus. It is celebrated by some Christian denominations.

September 27: World Tourism Day celebrated to foster awareness among the international community of the importance of tourism and its social, cultural, political, and economic value

September 27: Native American Day is a federal holiday observed annually on the fourth Friday in September in the states of California and Nevada and on the second Monday in October in South Dakota and Oklahoma.

September 28: Teacher's Day in Taiwan honors teachers' contributions to their students and society in general.

September 29: Michaelmas, or the Feast of Michael and All Angels, is a minor Christian festival dedicated to Archangel Michael that is observed in some Western liturgical calendars.
